



Extra-Curricular Activities / Excursion Eligibility Criteria

Inverell High School prides itself on offering as many opportunities as possible for students to engage in extra-curricular activities to enrich learning and school spirit.

These extra-curricular activities are a privilege for students, not a right, and as such the school requires students to meet all expectations during normal school activities in order to be considered for inclusion in extra-curricular activities.

In particular, the school endorses the following rules, regarding students' eligibility for extra-curricular activities:

Academic Standing

Students must hold a good academic standing, with all course requirements being met. Good academic standing is defined as follows:

Seniors- No unredeemed 'N' Determination Warnings

Juniors- No more than one unredeemed 'N' Determination Warnings

5 days before the activity, students' academic standing will be checked. If there are any outstanding warnings at this stage students to have until the day before the activity to redeem them all, to be considered eligible to attend.

Attendance

Students attendance rate is to be at 85% or above. Students with an attendance rate below 85% may apply to the Principal to be considered eligible. Attendance rates refer to whole days attendance between 8.55am to 2.30pm (unless approved flexible leave for seniors).

Behaviour

Students must not be on Level 2 or above of the Welfare & Discipline System.

Uniform

Students need to attend school in the correct uniform, as outlined in the Uniform Policy. Students who are on a uniform level are not eligible to represent the school.

Sporting Teams

Selection of students for sporting teams is at the discretion of the relevant coach in conjunction with the Sports Organiser. Selections are not made solely on ability, but a wide range of factors including, but not limited to, reliability, attendance at training sessions, teamwork, and attendance at school sporting carnivals.

Unauthorised Students at Extra-Curricular Activities /Excursions

If students who are not authorised by the school attend events (eg. watching a football game at a local venue), even if they are marked absent from school on that day, may lose their privileges to attend other extra-curricular activities for a duration as determined by the Principal.
